"To you who hear I say, love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you, pray for those who mistreat you."

To love our enemies is surely hard, unreasonable, yet it is also the most radical obedience that Jesus asks of his disciples as he continues his Sermon on the Plain. To love our enemies who victimize us makes us no longer victims; we become free people whose behavior is determined by no one else - except the Christ of whom we are disciples.

Luke 6:27

To love and not hate, to bless and not curse, to be generous and not demanding, to be compassionate and not self-centered - the choice is always there. For Christians, the strength to make such a choice depends on neither psychiatric theory nor theology; it is as simple and demanding as the words of the scriptures.

This is good news that, paradoxically, seems such "bad news." "Bad" because it goes against our spontaneous inclination to give as good as we get from those who are enemies, and we all have them! It is good news "to you who hear," because it is the word of Jesus. It is not hypothetical morality, but realistic Christian challenge to people who know what it is like to be slapped down, psychologically if not physically, whose generosity can be abused, and who find it difficult to extend love beyond friends, admirers, or benefactors.

The only motivation for this love is our kinship with God as daughters and sons, kinship with a God who is compassionate. *Mercy* is a most privileged gospel word. The responsorial Psalm 103 calls us to remember the mercy and love of God who forgives and removes our sins. Our gratitude to God for this should urge us to try to be worthy sons and daughters of God, likewise compassionate and forgiving of others.

It's not only radical for Jesus' time. This week it is worth the time to read the gospel a few times over, maybe even out loud. This is God's word. This is what Jesus telling us to do. There's no asterisk or extra context. This is it. Love your enemies. Pray for those who mistreat you. Lend expecting nothing back. Stop judging. Stop condemning. Forgive. That's it. That's the point. That's how we get to heaven. (*Living Liturgy, pp. 66-67*)

In the ancient disciple-rabbi relationship, the disciple would follow the rabbi so closely that he would be covered in the dust kicked up from his rabbi's feet. Thousands of years later, though we walk on roads of pavement and not dust, we



are still called to be disciples—to follow our Rabbi, Jesus Christ, so closely that we are covered with his life, changed, and made new.

But this transformation in Christ doesn't happen overnight. LOVE AS GOD LOVES

Our Gospel today continues Jesus' Sermon on the Plain, in which we heard Luke's version of the Beatitudes. This week, Jesus gives us new "commandments," telling us how to live and act in the world as his disciples, rooted in the radical love of God for humanity. It reminds us of his later speech about loving one another as he loves us, in other words with a God-like love, the kind we see in today's psalm about God's mercy. How else could we do as Jesus tells us by loving our enemies, which seems impossible, until we remember that God gave us the example of Jesus, who is like God but also like us? David understands this merciful love when he spares the life of his enemy in the first reading. Finally, Paul tells us that we will become like Jesus if we act as he did, as God does.
