Second Sunday



March 13, 2022 Then from the cloud came a voice that said, "This is my chosen Son; listen to him."

Luke describes Jesus' transfiguration as happening while he was praying. Jesus is joined by two of his ancestors, Moses and Elijah. The first of these, Moses, had to cope with his people who frequently grumbled about their exodus out of Egyptian slavery and into freedom. After spending forty days on Mount Sinai where God had called him to receive the divine teaching, Moses was transformed by his encounter and his face had become so radiant that when he came down from the mountain to his people, he needed to veil himself lest his brightness blind them Elijah had encountered God in the silence outside the cave on Mount Horeb/Sinai after his forty-day-flight from Jezebel, his too vicious slaughter of the false prophets she favored, and his arrogant ignoring of the other hundred true and hidden prophets of God.

At this time Jesus' disciples: Peter, James, and John, had been sleeping; the result from their mountain climb. The glory of the transfiguration eventually penetrated the fog of sleep and they became fully awake, they saw his glory and the two men standing with him. This was probably an awesome and terrifying scene for them. They wake up and their friend Jesus is talking with long-dead heroes, in a cloud of glory. It's almost as if they stumbled into a private meeting of the divine. Peter' reaction is rash but not logical; he suggests building tents (what we would call altars) to honor the three superheroes standing in front of him. What else could he do? We get another encounter with Peter's humanity when Luke tells us, "But he did not know what he was saying."

The first reading is another "mountaintop" moment, in which God makes a covenant with Abram. Abram's scene includes shocking theatrics, like Peter's. Abram sets up his sacrifice of animals, and then the sun sets. "When the sun had set and it was dark, there appeared a smoking fire pot and a flaming torch, which passed between those pieces." In the midst of this otherworldly experience, God makes a promise to Abram and sets in motion a relationship with Abram's family that will come to fruition in the person of Jesus, eighteen hundred years later.

In the Gospel the disciples go down the mountain, onto the plain; and the struggle to understand Jesus goes on. On the plains of our everyday life, we struggle to respond to the Father's command: to listen to the Son, to become children of the light in his light, and brothers and sisters who are ready to risk the unfamiliar and new because we are enveloped in the security of God's presence and promise. After the mountain of Jesus' transfiguration comes the hill of his crucifixion. Our pilgrim legs have to be strong for both climbs, and though we may not always recognize it, the "mountaintop" experiences are often occasions where God allows us to catch our breath for the next and harder ascents. *Living Liturgy, pp. 82-83*







Everything we know about Joseph comes from Scripture—and there isn't much information. He was a carpenter. (Matt 13:55) He wasn't rich Luke 2:24). He was compassionate and open to the will of God, taking Mary as his wife, knowing her unborn child was

not his. (Matt 1:19-25) We know he loved Jesus, moving him to Egypt and then Nazareth, leaving behind everything, to keep him safe; searching or him for 3 days when he was missing. St Patrick was born in Britain to wealthy parents. Taken captive by Irish raiders when he was 16 he spent the next 6 years working as a shepherd. He was eventually sent back to Ireland to attend to the needs of the Christians and to convert the rest of the population. Familiar with the Irish language and
