Jesus said to him,
"Feed my sheep."

John 21:17

Peter, the leader, has gone back to the everyday, the familiar way of being a fisherman, taking with him six other disciples. There is Thomas, who hovered between disbelief and belief until his experience with the wounded and risen Lord; Nathanael, the true Israelite without guile who had to decide whether anything good had really come out of Nazareth; James and John, who had their own problems with statue seeking; and two unnamed disciples, one of whom is later revealed as the Beloved Disciple, John. Into the shoes of the seventh unnamed disciple we may step, while still at time recognizing that we also walk in the footsteps of the others. These seven, the number of fullness, symbolize more than just a part of the apostolic group; they represent the whole community of believers down through the centuries who will encounter the risen Lord, be called by him to let down their nets into the sea of humanity, eat with him, profess their love for him, and follow him in many different ways.

The gospel begins as a night scene of failure, with no fish caught. Then the sun rises, and the disciples are hailed from the shore by someone who calls them "children." The stranger tells them to let down their nets, and emptiness is filled with a great catch. Then with the sun rising and the dawn of faith breaking the disciples whom Jesus loves, who rested his head in the heart of Jesus, who stood his ground at the cross and holds the preeminent place of intimate contemplation giving him the keen eyes of faith, sees and proclaims with deference to Peter: "It is the Lord." It is Peter, the model for pastoral leadership, but leadership that is also dependent on contemplative insight, who plunges into the water. Always eager and impetuous, he makes his way to Jesus. Again we are reminded that the way to the risen Lord is through the waters, through the baptism into which we are plunged.

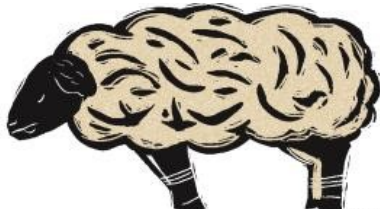
When they come to the shore, the disciples are invited to breakfast at a charcoal fire on which bread and fish are cooking. As with an earlier feeding, the disciples, too, are to be involved in the preparation of this meal. Jesus tells them to bring some of the fish they have just caught, and it is Peter, in his leadership role, who hauls the net, heavy with fish, from the water's edge. The word used for "drag" is the same word that John used to describe how the Father will "draw" people to Jesus and Jesus himself will "draw" others to himself when he is exalted on the cross. Such a "drawing" or "gathering" is the pastoral effort Peter is to make as leaders of the church.

Through the readings last week and this week, we are able to watch Peter's transformation from a timid and impulsive "sidekick" into the leader Jesus always knew he would be. Peter has fumbled his way through the gospel since we met him, and Jesus never, ever stopped drawing him close. Even after denying Jesus at the crucial moment, and then hiding in a house after Jesus died, Peter finally finds the guts to stand up, in front of the highest authorities in his community, calling them out, and leading the people to Jesus. *Living Liturgy*, pp. 122-123.

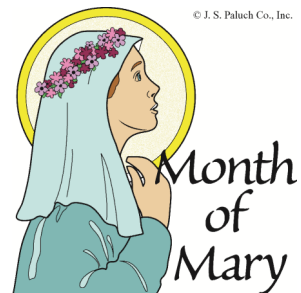

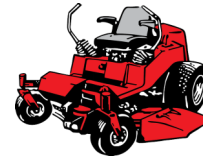
