THE Ascension OF THE LORD



MAY 29

We all have experienced having to say goodbye and return home without someone we love: a sick parent, a son or daughter beginning college, a soldier departing for active service, the airport farewell to a dear friend. We have to leave each other, but it's hard to go. The aspect of the Easter mystery of the ascension is about not only Jesus' departure and homecoming, but also ours.

In the readings for this feast we have two accounts of the ascension: one at the end of Luke's gospel, closing the period of his earthly ministry; the other at the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles and the beginning of the church's mission. Through these two accounts, Luke emphasizes the historical continuity of the mystery of the risen Christ. Jesus departure is a continuing challenge to the disciples of the "in-between-time" of the church. In the gospel, the ascension takes place on Easter day; in Acts, it is forty days later.

For forty days the apostles are to be in the company of the risen Jesus, eating with him, and waiting on the Holy Spirit the promise of the Father, who will be given them. They are to do this in Jerusalem, the city of prophet and the end point of Jesus' earthly journey in Luke's gospel. The earthly ministry of Jesus having been completed, in the "forty days" Jesus instructs his apostles about the beginning and continuing mission of the church. It is to be in the power of the Holy Spirit, its members believing in his risen presence, eating at table, witnessing beyond Jerusalem to the ends of the earth and gathering and waiting together in joyful expectation. *LivingLiturgy*, p. 138


