

# FOURTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

JULY 3, 2022



*The harvest is abundant*  
but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest  
to send out laborers for his harvest.

LUKE 10:2

This week we learn what it means to be a disciple of Christ Jesus. Jesus sends out his followers to all the towns he intends to visit on route to Jerusalem and tells them to bring good news about the harvest, referencing both the crop planted and himself, the Bread of Life. Jesus delegates and sends them on MISSION. The mission of Christians from this passage suggests:

✠The world needs the mission of Christians because there is a plentiful harvest waiting to be reaped.

✠Prayer to “the master of the harvest” is essential for the empowering of the harvesters.

✠Since Jesus sends us on mission, we can be confident of his active protection.

✠There is a reminder that there are “wolves” to be confronted on the way - personal, communal, and structural realities that will try to hunt down and consume those who proclaim the gospel.

✠We are called to travel light; money, possessions, or concern with status can be hindering baggage.

✠We are to “greet no one,” not a recommendation for brash impoliteness, but a condemnation of social dalliance and time-consuming gossip.

✠We are to offer Jesus’ resurrection greeting: “Peace be with you,” to be freely accepted or rejected.

✠Hospitality, good missionaries do not impose their own cultural expectations on others but are nourished by whatever the host offers, both personal and social.

✠There is also a realistic expectation of failure, of being resisted and rejected as Jesus was.

✠No matter, we persevere in our proclamation of the reign of God by our words, our relationships, and our rituals.

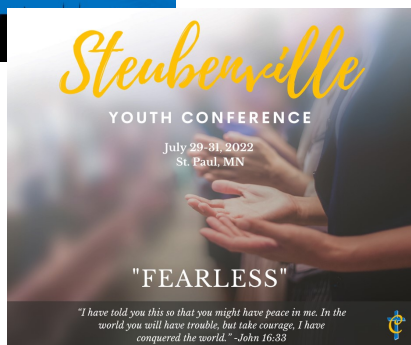

## GOOD NEWS IS ON THE WAY

This week, in the midst of summer, the scriptures greet us with joy, peace, mercy, and more peace! Sounds a little like Advent, doesn't it? We often associate the prophet Isaiah with that preparatory season, and our first reading rings with such words as exult, comfort, and rejoice. The Israelites had reason to rejoice, for they had returned, come home, to a rebuilt Jerusalem from their exile in Babylon.

In the Gospel, the seventy-two disciples who were sent out have their own "homecoming," returning to Jesus from spreading the Good News of the Kingdom and preparing people for the "advent" of Jesus into their cities and towns on his long road to Jerusalem. Like the exiles in Isaiah, the disciples return rejoicing.

The Good News, the Kingdom of God, is coming, even in summer. As today's psalm reminds us, "Shout joyfully to God, all the earth!"

We also have a **Kindergarten long term substitute** position available beginning mid-October through December 22<sup>nd</sup>.

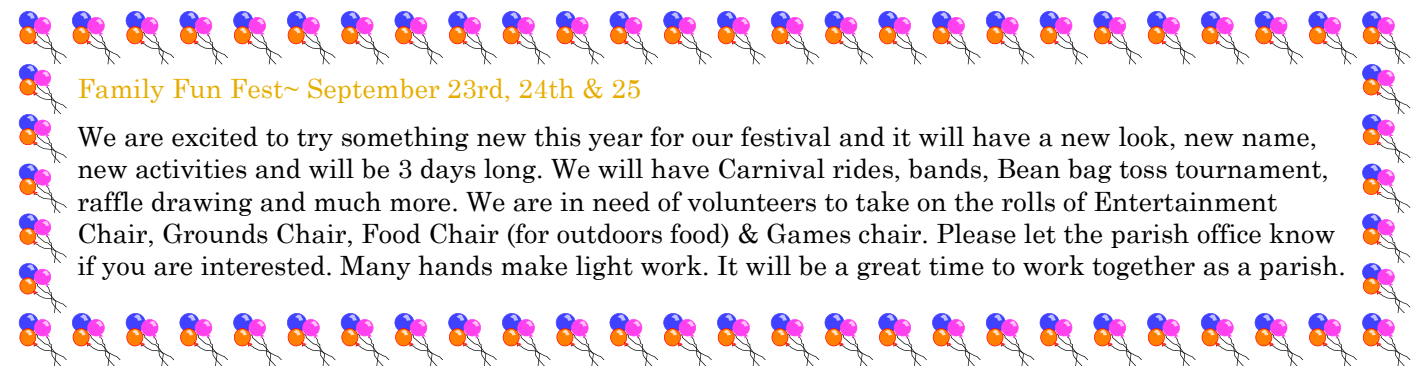
