
# The Most HOLY TRINITY JUNE 12, 2022

We mark our foreheads with the sign of the cross and name the Three Persons so often, but do we know the significance of these words and gestures? At the beginning of our Christian lives, at baptism, we are named for them; at the beginning and end of each Eucharist we sign ourselves with their memory; when our bodies are signed at death, we hope they claim us; when we bless our children, we remember the creativity the Trinity shares with us. All these moments of naming the Trinity are occasions of life and love. When we are blessed "in the name of," we are incorporated in the personal history of the one named. The sign of the cross and the invocation of the Trinity, a prayer of gesture and words that we learned in childhood, are a simple yet profound statement that we belong to Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and are called to live in communion with them.

As we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity today, we celebrate a God who always reveals more of God's self to us. No matter how much time we spend in prayer or studying theological texts, it is impossible for us to fully encapsulate our description or understanding of God. Fortunately, today's gospel gives us some helpful insight: "Everything that the Father has is mine; for this reason I told you that (the Spirit of Truth) will take from what is mine and declare it to you" Relationship, namely the relationship between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, is the foundation of the Trinity.

God is relational by God's very nature, and the triune God also invites us into this relationship. As we are created in the image and likeness of God, we take part in this relationship of love that is constantly poured and shared between members. We hear this in today's second reading, "The love of God has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us." When we respond to this love and share the love, we actively participate in the mystery of the Trinity. *Living Liturgy, pp. 152-154*.

Just a reminder: SCRIP is available for sale after weekend masses and during regular business hours at the St A's parish office.





#### **BIBLICAL ROOTS OF THE TRINITY**

Today's readings show some biblical roots of what Christians would later call the Trinity. Proverbs showcases the role of Wisdom in the work of creation, portraved as a reality outside of God but integrated into God's work of forming the heavens and the earth. We join the psalmist in sharing Wisdom's delight in God's handiwork: "O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth" (Psalm 8:2). In his letter to the Romans, Paul writes of peace with God through Jesus, and the love of God received through the Holy Spirit, distinguishing God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit while also displaying their abiding unity. Finally, in the farewell discourse from John's Gospel, Jesus—who had earlier spoken of himself as Son of the Father-promises his friends that they will receive the Spirit of truth that will teach and guide them after his departure.

We also have a **Kindergarten long term substitute** position available beginning mid-October through December 22<sup>nd</sup>.


