




The central gift of our Catholic faith is the Eucharist, the "thanksgiving" we share when we invite Christ's real presence into our bodies. This physical reality is also the aspect of Catholicism that separates us from most other Christian denominations. And yet, today's readings show us just how seamless the elevation of this act is, from the establishment of God's relationship with Abraham to the first Christian communities.

When the disciples state that they only have five loaves and two fish to feed the gathered crowds, they do not realize that the Bread of Life is in their midst. As Jesus prays, breaks, and shares today, he foreshadows his future death and resurrection. Likewise, Jesus makes it abundantly clear that his disciples must follow his example in their own lives. When Jesus says, "Give them some food yourselves," he shows that they must take an active role in bringing about the kingdom of God. The paschal mystery is deeply communal. So is the Eucharist. To limit out understanding of Eucharist to an individual or private relationship with Jesus is insufficient.

As Christians, our remembering is not a passive event where we simply recall what has happened in the past. Rather, our remembering is active. When we follow Jesus' command to break the bread and share the cup, we not only remember the historical Jesus of the past, but with these words and actions we also celebrate Jesus' presence with us today as he continues to nourish and sustain us. We remember the past, celebrate in the present, and look forward to the future where the reign of God will be fulfilled.

Such is the superabundant hospitality of God in Christ, there will always be more than enough food to feed the future church (twelve baskets left over). But one thing is needed: hands to give the food to the people, labor's in the field of the Church! *Living Liturgy pp. 156-158.*



We also have a **Kindergarten long term substitute** position available beginning mid-October through December 22nd.




Reading and math support: 1 or 2 hours per day usually in the morning.


