Jesus expresses his greatest desire for humanity, for whose sake he took human nature and for the fulfillment of the saving plan of God in us, when he says, "I wish that where I am they also may be with me."

The unity of the Trinity with believers comes to fulfillment at the heavenly habitation. The ministry of Jesus Christ for our sake carries within it the invitation to live on earth with the same mind that is in Jesus Christ in order for believers to prepare for life in the heavenly kingdom. The ultimate end of our earthly life is to be with God and share eternity with Jesus Christ. The Easter season invites us to prepare for this life through acts of love, humility, and compassion toward one another, which are the virtues of our Christian life and holiness.

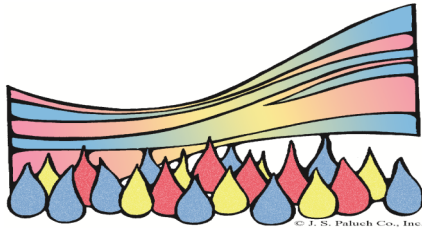
John's gospel gives us Jesus's final prayer and, in doing so, gives us a glimpse into the loving heart of this fully human, fully divine Lord. As with much of John's gospel, Jesus is speaking not only with a command but with deep, tender love. Jesus is from the Lord, and prays that we know it, but he also reflects on the gift he has received is us. We are God's gift to Jesus. We spend so much time and energy on the knowledge that Jesus is a gift, and that our lives are a gift, and that God showers us with gifts, but how often do we reflect on the notion that we, ourselves, are a gift to God? Do you ever wonder about how the way we choose to live our lives, and be in

relationship with God and one another, is our gift to God? Jesus offers this tender, precious reflection on the value we hold simply by being ourselves. We are a gift to Jesus. You, without and qualifying act are a gift to the Lord. And you are valued as such. *Living Liturgy, pp. 142-143*

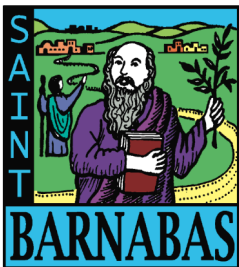
SCRIP

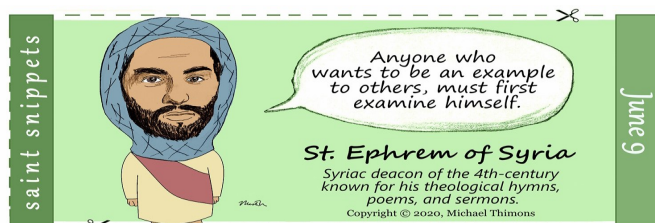

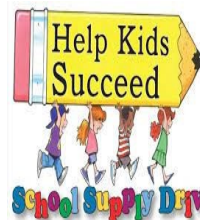
THE SPIRIT'S ACTIVE POWER

The mystery of the Trinity refers to one God in three persons. We frequently acknowledge Jesus as "the second person of the Trinity," but referring also to the Spirit as a "person" comes less naturally. In religious art, the Holy Spirit often appears as a dove or, as in today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles, tongues of fire. Much rarer are images of the Spirit as a "person" in recognizable human form. Today's readings do not settle the issue of how to picture the Spirit, but they certainly give shape to the Spirit's active power in the world and in each human heart. In Acts, the Spirit enables people to speak and understand a variety of languages. Paul's letter to the Corinthians praises the Spirit for all kinds of spiritual gifts, services, and "workings." Finally, in John's Gospel, Jesus calls the Spirit our Advocate and our divine teacher.
