

AND WHO IS MY NEIGHBOR?

Fifteenth SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The parable of the Good Samaritan invites us to imagine all the roles we might play in this parable. Have you been the man beaten, and then helped by a stranger you thought was an enemy? Have you been the Samaritan? Have you been the priest or the judge who saw something happen and kept walking? The brilliance of this story is that humanity is expressed in all of the characters, those who offer help and those who turn away. We will, at different times in our life, be each of these characters. The goal of course, is to be the Samaritan. A few thoughts to challenge us with this parable:

- How often do legalism and love seem to compete in our lives and our church? Jesus shares the parable of the Good Samaritan in response to a legal expert asking about the process for inheriting eternal life. In this story of the Good Samaritan, Jesus shows that love must take precedence over legalism. Mercy must triumph over strict adherence. This must have been unsettling for some people to hear. If we are honest. It might also unsettle us a bit. Authentic love is not legalism.
- This idea of love of God and love of neighbor is radical. We know we are to love God, but sometimes loving our neighbor isn't easy. It is important to note that the merciful person in this story is not a religious leader but a Samaritan, often considered to be the enemy of the Jewish people. If even our enemies can show mercy, how much more should we be able to be merciful in our lives?
- ✤ As we grow in relationship with Christ, we also come to realize that we are not always the Good Samaritan in this story. Sometimes we must be the recipient of mercy shown by others. And that is a good thing! Part of living in a relationship with others is a constant sharing and receiving of love, mercy, and forgiveness. This is the way of Christ. RIGHT RELATIONSHIPS

Our God is about relationships. In the first reading, Moses reminds the Israelites that the laws, which are already in their hearts, keep them in right relationship with the God who loves them so much that they always find forgiveness. Centuries later, along comes Jesus, whom Paul describes to the Colossians as "the image of the invisible God," the very embodiment of this God of love. In his parable about the good Samaritan, Jesus explains how the law of love overrules the letter of the law. Instead of answering the question "Who is my neighbor?" Jesus demonstrates that it is not about who is worthy of being loved, but rather loving as God loves—about *being* neighbor, about being the good Samaritan. Jesus wants us to continue his work as images of this God of love by loving all people, even those who seem to be our enemies.

We also have a **Kindergarten long term substitute** position available beginning mid-October through December 22nd.


