Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

What is your daily bread? What feeds you, that makes you feel whole, and that keeps you going? It can be many things - the love of a spouse, the dignity of a satisfying job, the Eucharist. Whatever it is, it is probably based on relationship. We say the Our Father many times in Catholic life, so much so that it becomes a passing set of words, more meditation than active. This week we have an opportunity to reflect on the true value of a petition to the Lord. Every time we pray, "Give us each day our daily bread," we are the man knocking on the door of his neighbor. We are heard, even if we don't always remember that we are asking.

How many times have you looked at the failing aspect of your faith and wondered if you were worthy of grace? Anxiety and doubt are a part of being human and will inevitably creep in over and over during the lifetime of Christians. As the Lord calms Abraham's fears, we can be calmed by the knowledge that, like Sodom, we may be pardoned by the Lord as long as some small good remains in us.

- In today's gospel the disciples ask Jesus to teach them how to pray. This is an interesting request, as the disciples have been following Jesus for some time now. They have surely seen Jesus pray before. If we look throughout the gospels, we see accounts of Jesus praying in any number of circumstances or situations. Jesus prays prayers of blessing and benediction. Jesus prays prayers of gratitude and thanksgiving. Jesus prays communally and privately. With this, the Lord's Prayer is situated within a much larger context of Jesus teaching his followers to pray in the everyday events of their lives.
- The Lord's Prayer is a prayer *par excellence* in the sense that it not only affirms our ultimate dependence on God but also insists that we as the people of God must be invested in our prayer. Jesus says, "Forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us" and continues with the story of the friend who asks for bread. Pope Francis attested, "You pray for the hungry. Then you feed them.. That's how prayer works." Prayer is a way of living in relationship with God and others.
- We must also remember that the answers to prayer do not always look like what we might expect. When Jesus asks who would give a scorpion instead of an egg, or a snake instead of a fish, our immediate response is "No one would ever do that." But this is a human way of thinking. Perhaps the scorpion or snake are actually answered prayers, as God answers prayer according to God's will, not ours. May we be open to all possibilities of God's answered prayer. 




