

Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions.

Luke 12:15

The toils of the rich man in today's gospel and vanity seen in our first reading, "Here is one who has labored with wisdom and knowledge and skill, and yet to another who has not labored over it, he must leave his property." However, it's not just the work of gaining property; it is the anxiety that accompanies just pursuit. "For what profit comes to man from all the toil and anxiety of heart with which he has labored under the sun?"

It is good to ensure the care and safety of our families and communities. Jesus emphasizes the necessity of worldly care when he calls us, over and over, to ensure basic necessities for the poor. However, this gospel is clear in its message, and Jesus does not shy away from being critical of a man who spent his time ensuring the accumulation of and ability to sustain his personal wealth. We have a tendency in the modern era to immediately extrapolate what this means for the distribution of wealth among nations and implications for economies. This is noble work, but try reading this gospel as a message for you, and only you. Start with your own life.

- Jesus say, "Take care to guard against all greed for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." Easier said than done, right! Greed creeps into our boardroom meetings as we challenge colleagues and assert our dominance. Greed appears in families where children might not be willing to share material objects or even one's attention. We can be greedy in ways that are not monetary.
- If we are to combat greed, it is important to step back and evaluate what we treasure and value. The answer for the rich man in today's parable is obvious: he values a bountiful harvest and the ability and freedom to store his riches for himself. But this control is fleeting, as his material goods will do nothing for him after his untimely death. Jesus invites us to look at this example and reflect on our own lives. What are we looking for? What will satisfy us? And ultimately, in what ways do we continue to grab and hoard and live with greed instead of practicing hospitality and generosity and self-gift?
- St Augustine writes: "Our hearts are restless until they rest in you, O God." Nothing can satisfy us except for relationship with God. When we come to realize that God is our greatest desire, the one whom we seek above all else, we begin to notice that material things are not as important. Likewise, when we recognize that relationship with God is our deepest longing, we come to know that part of this relationship is caring for others by sharing the gifts God has given us. We do not exist as isolated individuals. Life is God fundamentally means life is community. Living Liturgy, pp. 187-188


