TWENTY-SIXTH Sunday

in Ordinary Time

In an address to the United Nations on September 25, 2020, Pope Francis writes: "We are faced, then, with a choice between two possible paths. One path leads to the consolidation of multilateralism as the expression of a renewal sense of global coresponsibility, a solidary grounded in justice and the attainment of peace and unity within the human family, which is God's plan for our world. The other path emphasizes self-sufficiency, nationalism, protectionism, individualism and isolation; it excludes the poor, the vulnerable and those dwelling on the peripheries of life. That path would certainly be detrimental to the whole community, causing self-inflicted wounds on everyone. It must not prevail."

Today's parable of Lazarus and the Rich Man invites us to consider these words of Pope Francis. How do reconcile the fact that while some people live in extravagance, others are struggling to eat? By including details about the rich man's "purple garments and fine linen," Luke reveals that this person is not just well-off. Rather, as purple dye was expensive and difficult to obtain, this man was the richest of the rich, living a luxurious lifestyle. Throughout the gospel, Jesus does not necessarily condemn people who are wealthy simply for having wealth. Rather, as we have seen in the readings for the past several Sundays, Jesus denounces people who have an excess of resources that they are unwilling to share with others.

In true Lukan fashion, care for people who are poor or marginalized in some way is the essence of Jesus' mission and ministry. The rich man had the opportunity to be in relationship with Lazarus but chose not to share his time or treasures with him. We also have the opportunity to grow in relationship with people who are hurting and lonely, and sick and hungry. How do we choose to respond? *Living Liturgy*, *p*222



A Prayer of Thanksgiving for Our New Bishop


God our Father and Creator,
