

Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time

October 16, 2022

"Will not God then secure the rights of his chosen ones who will call out to him day and night?"

In the gospel for today, Jesus uses the example of someone who won't give up, who continues to ask, over and over, for what she justly deserves until a disinterested party, the judge, relents and gives in. If this judge, who can't be bothered to do his job, relents in the face of persistence, how much more will our Lord, who desires to help us, be moved? Bearing this in mind, we should not give up when it seems that our prayers aren't being answered.

To do anything without ceasing is difficult. Perhaps this is why there is often an urge to dismiss Jesus' command as utterly impractical and unrealistic. If we are to understand Jesus' words; however, we must begin to understand prayer as a lived reality, something we do every day. Only when we live our lives as a prayer, when we know that everything we do connects us to God who loves us, can we begin to pray without ceasing. Prayer, then, is less about what we do or say and more about a relationship with God.

Part of growing in a relationship with God is growing in transparency with God. We do not tell God our needs and petitions to let God know what is in our hearts. God knows us better than we know ourselves and God knows our needs better than we can possibly express. Instead, we share our needs with God so that we might grow in greater transparency with God. Part of growing in relationship with anyone is practicing authenticity, where one can simply be one's self around another person. When we are able to live authentically and grow as the person we are called to be, we are indeed living lives of prayer.

Pope Francis also reminds us that to pray without ceasing is to be keenly aware of the needs of our brothers and sisters. Every time we work for justice and peace and unity we articulate our prayer through our lives. When we put someone else's needs before our own or help meet the spiritual or physical needs of someone, we grow in relationship with Christ. There is a popular phrase attributed to Pope Francis: "You pray for the hungry and then you feed them. This is how prayer works." When we live in a right relationship with God and others, we can heed Jesus' command and truly pray without ceasing.

To prayer that is persistent and constant must also be added the qualities of trust and patience that support the belief that God answers persevering prayer when and how God wills. That the timeline may be lengthy is suggested by the parable between the preceding narrative about the "last s," Luke 17:20-37 and the last verse of today's reading Luke 18:8. Our faith should be "night and day" faith like Anna's, the first widow when we meet in Luke's gospel, Lk 2:37, faith that endures until the coming of the Son of Man at the end of both our own personal life and the Second Coming at the end of human history. 
