This week's gospel introduces one of the Advent' main characters: John the Baptist. And he is treated as a character here, given a more vivid description than many biblical figures. We are meant to picture him; we know what he wears and what he eats. He is rough. He is unkept. He is blunt. He is, in a word, weird. And yet, people are drawn to him, listening to his preaching and going to be baptized. Throughout the Advent and Christmas seasons, we hear stories of God coming in ways we didn't expect, from this bizarre desert preacher to a literal infant born into poverty. In John the Baptist, holiness could have been overlooked because of his oddities. But the season insists on reminding us to keep our eyes open to the truth that God often comes disgusted in interruption and inconvenience.

Imagine a world in which the words of God through the prophet Isaiah ring true: "There shall be no harm or ruin on all my holy mountains." Imagine living this way now. Many days, our world seems far from God's vision of peace and justice: Black people lie dying in the streets, refugees flee violence only to be turned away at the border, young people face bullying online. There is much work to be done to end harm and ruin. We need the prayer for endurance and encouragement from today's second reading. The work of justice is grueling and slow. It can take years to see the wolves and lambs of our time graze together - if we ever see it at all. Yet, imbued with the spirit of the Lord we are called to keep working toward God's glorious vision.

John the Baptist displays a wildness that we would do well to embrace this Advent season. The Christian way is rarely neat and tidy. The Spirit of God blows where it wills, wildly with no constraints. Enlivened by this Spirit, how can you tap into your own wild side this Advent? What would it look like for you to drop the things constraining you from loving God with your whole heart?

The image of a root appears in the first reading and the gospel. The writers of Scripture often draw on images of plants to signify spiritual growth and connectedness to Christ. As we prepare for the birth of Christ, reflect on the roots of your faith. Who or what keeps you grounded?

Gift of Grain

Farmers can qualify for income and selfemployment tax savings on raised grain if the unsold grain is gifted to your parish. The grain must be delivered to an elevator and the actual storage ticket should be given to the parish. In order to qualify for the tax savings, it's critical that the parish sells the grain and not the person gifting the grain. PRAYER OF THE WEEK OUR FASCINATING FAITH

The Immaculate Conception (December 8)

December 8 we celebrate the patronal solemnity of the United States and the greatest of Mary's Advent festivals. On that day we remember Mary's conception in the womb of her mother (and nine months later, on September 8, we celebrate Mary's birth). In this liturgy, we affirm our belief that God prepared Mary to be the mother of the son of God by allowing her a share, from the moment of her conception, in the salvation that would be won for all by Christ.

Five mothers make their presence felt on December 8. The first is Eve, the mother of all the living. The second is Mary's mother, who conceived, brought to birth, and nurtured an "immaculate" daughter who would become the mother of the Word made Flesh. The third is Elizabeth, who conceived her son John "in her old age." The fourth, of course, is Mary herself. Finally, the letter to the Ephesians and the texts of the Mass for this feast remind us that the Church has been "chosen" to be a spiritual mother. We pray: "The image of the Virgin is found in your Church . . . Trace in our actions the lines of her love, in our hearts her readiness of faith."

In this Advent time, we are called, as Mary was, to make room for Christ in our hearts. What will it take, what will be the cost for us to become, as Mary became, real "bearers of the Word?" Let us be open to the intercession of Mary on our behalf, that we may become more and more like her beloved Son.
