"AMEN, I SAY TO YOU, TODAY YOU WILL BE WITH ME IN PARADISE."

LUKE 23:43

Stumbling along, sometimes backtracking, we have tried to follow Jesus through another year of grace. With the many people we have met along the Lukan way, we have accepted or refused the hospitality of God that invites us each Sunday to be fed at the tables of both Word and Sacrament so that we might go out to nourish with compassion our sisters and brother, especially the most hungry and thirsty whose lives are in ruins. And so we come to the Sunday that closes Year C and are confronted with the stark realism of the gospel choice for this Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the universe.

To the end, Jesus endures the wilderness temptations, the beginning of his public ministry, not on the pinnacle of the temple but from the height of the cross. Luke writes of Jesus' temptation in the desert: "When the devil had finished every temptation, he departed from him for a time." The devil does not leave Jesus forever, but waits for opportune times to resume temptation. As we read these words in concert with today's gospel, the soldiers' shouts seem even more significant: "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself."

Jesus is the epitome of kindship precisely because he rejects these false notions of power and authority. Jesus does not act in self-interest. As always, Jesus lives and loves for others, and calls us to do the same. The Lord, robed in majesty, offers salvation to the repentant thief and to all of us. The psalmist today embodies our elation: "I rejoiced because they said to me, 'We will go up to the house of the Lord."

As we look forward to the new liturgical year that begins in Advent (next Sunday), may we remember this image of Christ the King and turn to it often, for it helps us understand the reality of Christianity: Power comes from humility, selfishness falls to sacrifice, and life springs from death. *Living Liturgy, pp. 256-257.*




