

# THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

January 22, 2023

Jesus calls the disciples in pairs - a powerful reminder that discipleship happens in community. Each of us brings particular gifts, but those gifts are not meant to be siloed, kept for ourselves. Christ calls each of us to follow him in communion with fellow believers, just as he did with Simon, Andrew, James and John. Together, we can further Christ's work of proclaiming the gospel to the ends of the earth.


Jesus calls the disciples in ordinary moments - a valuable reminder for this between the end of Christmas and the start of Lent. It can be easy to discount the daily calls when we compare our experiences to popular seasonal stories from Scripture. An angel ever appeared to me, Jesus never transfigured atop a mountain as I stood there watching. Am I still called? Indeed, Jesus utters the command "follow me" in the places we live and work. Each ordinary day offers the chance to put down our nets and follow him.

Last week we heard John the Baptist's account of Jesus' baptism. Today's gospel from Matthew brings us to the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. He calls disciples, teaches, preaches, and cures all over Galilee. We will hear more detailed stories of Jesus' activity in the coming weeks. He certainly kept busy! However, let us not miss the very first action Jesus takes in today's gospel: he withdraws. Upon hearing that John had been arrested, Jesus withdraws to Galilee. The gospel writer does not detail what Jesus did during his time away, but if it is like other instances, we can imagine Jesus spending time in quiet prayer to the Father. This too is an important act of ministry.



## **OUR FASCINATING FAITH**

## **Ordinary Time**

Between the end of the Christmas season and the start of Lent, the liturgical year begins a period known as Ordinary Time. That season is interrupted by the seasons of Lent and Easter, and then resumes again after Pentecost. The English translation of the Latin name for this season has received much criticism because of our association of the word "ordinary" with something of lesser value, the opposite of something special. Critics point out that Sunday is the original feast day of the Church, that there is nothing at all "ordinary" about our weekly celebration of the Lord's dying and rising. Translators explain that in this context the English word "ordinary" retains the root meaning of "ordinal," something counted "in order," and that the Sundays throughout the year are in fact named by their numerical order.

It is helpful to understand how all five of the "special" seasons of the liturgical year (Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent, Easter) fit together to unfold the single mystery of Christ. As we continue the year now with Ordinary Time, we are mindful that what we celebrate is indeed as "extraordinary" an experience of God's grace as one could ever imagine.

Budget for the project was set at: \$ 305,000.00










