"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

Matthew 5:3

When hashtags started becoming popular on social media, the hashtag "blessed" quickly turned sarcastic. It is used most often to make fun of the few who do use it sincerely, because it seems that they are often those who habitually overshadow or who attribute their life's luxuries to the blessing of God. We know, deep down, that having pretty, Instagramable things is not actually a sign of God's blessing. In the Gospel for today, Jesus also turns around what "blessed" means, but he does it in all sincerity. He affirms that those who practice hard spiritual disciplines, whose lives may not appear "blessed" in an earthly sense, are in fact those favored by God. Jesus reminds us that what we see is not always the truth of the matter; God is up to something greater than that which we can perceive.

We all know Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. The Beatitudes are scripted and framed in parish halls across the world. But the Beatitudes can't be relegated to some familiar, lofty statements about the Christian life. Jesus calls serious bluff on what society values most: wealth, power, prestige. He flips the tables on who truly is blessed: the poor, the persecuted, the peacemakers. Jesus preaches a radical sermon that should jar us to action. The Beatitudes aren't meant to just be looked at - they are meant to be lived.

Jesus names many types of blessed people in today's gospel. Let us call to mind holy people who fall into each category - the mourners in our pews, the advocates thirsting for righteousness in our streets, the persecuted crossing the southern border. By calling names, faces, and stories, we bring to life in flesh and bone the teachings of Jesus.

Humility is a theme threading through today's readings. Zephaniah implores the humble of the earth to "seek justice, seek humility." St. Paul proclaims that God "chose the weak of the world." Jesus himself blesses the meek. What does it look like to take on a posture of humility in today's world? Aren't the meek and lowly at risk of being exploited or abused? The power dynamics that riddle communities today will be no more in the kingdom of God - for our God is a God of justice. God's ways will prevail, no matter how far all it seems now. The call to act humbly challenges us to trust in God's almighty power.

We know that God's values are not our own; we hear this repeatedly in Scripture. But, saturated in a culture that values other things, we forget very easily. We put our time and attention into gathering money and security and social capital, even when we know this is not what Jesus asks of us. Consider the Beatitudes this week and how God might be using them to invite us into letting go of one of these false values. *Living Liturgy p. 49*



Candlemas (February 2)

Thanks to Pope Sergius I (687–701), on February 2 we celebrate the Presentation of the Lord. On this day we also commemorate the Purification of Mary, who complied with the Jewish law (Leviticus 12:1). The law indicated that a mother should be purified forty days after giving birth to a boy child. Since the eleventh century the Purification of Mary and the Presentation of the Lord have been celebrated with the blessing of all the candles and candlesticks that are going to be used during the year. This is done with the hope that there will never be a lack of light, either material or spiritual, in the houses of the faithful. The root of the word candlemas is the Latin verb candere ("to shine") and from which also come the words candelabra and candlestick. This feast of candles recalls that Christians can, like Simon and the prophetess Anna in the temple, say that they also have seen salvation: Jesus the true Light who shines in the arms of Mary (Luke 2:25–38).




