


GIFTS OF GOLD, FRANKINCENSE, AND MYRRH.

Matthew 2:11

The prophet Isaiah calls upon the Israelites to rise up and shine in today's first reading. It is not an easy task for people worn and weary after years of exile. The Israelites lived in darkness for so long. Isaiah's vision of the glory to come may seem farfetched yet, if this season of Christmas has taught us anything, it is that nothing is impossible for God. The divine light can - and will - transform even the darkest corners and thickest clouds. God's glory persists. God's glory engulfs the beloved people. God's glory shines bright for all to see.

Who is God calling you to be in this new year? The Epiphany story points to many ways God calls each one of us. The magi saw the star because they were paying attention; they were scholars who studied the stars. When they started their study, the magi could not have imagined themselves bearing witness to such a hugely unique event. Only once in history will this happen. The birth of Jesus changes the universe in ways more significant than the appearance of a new celestial body. For the magi, a lifetime of cultivating knowledge and attentiveness culminated in this exceptional moment. They were called to come pay homage to a newborn king. For us, too, our interests and skills can become places of encounter with the God who made all things and who gave us the talents we have. Like the magi, we may experience a major moment of clarity when God's calling shines as brightly as a star in the night sky. More likely, we will experience God's callings in the midst of our everyday lives just as the magi did, in the fields of our homes, schools, and workplaces. How will you respond?

The Epiphany story draws our attention to divine revelation in and among creation. A star leads the magi to Jerusalem. After meeting with Herod, the magi follow the same star to the child Jesus. The guiding star glowed in the night sky as a sign of the divine presence. Creation offers the same direction to us today. Gaze up into the night sky tonight. Revel in the magnitude of stars shining against the darkness. Listen to God speaking through the natural world. *Living Liturgy, p. 35*



Epiphany House Blessing

If you wish, you can celebrate Epiphany at home with a blessing using the initials of the magi's traditional names (Casper, Melchior, Balthasar), four crosses, and the new year's numerals.

Materials: a piece of chalk and a small container of holy water. Gather with family members, friends, and perhaps some neighbors at the front door.

Leader: In the (+) name of the Father, and of the

Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

We sign this doorway with four crosses and the numerals of the new year.

[20 + C + M + B + 23]

Let us pray: May Christ bless this house!

ALL: Amen!

Each room of the house is sprinkled with holy water.

Living room: Where two or three are gathered in your name, Lord, you are present. Bless this room, O Lord.

ALL: Amen!

Kitchen: Give us this day our daily bread. Bless this room, O Lord. **ALL:** Amen!

Dining room: Prepare us for the heavenly banquet.

Bless this room, O Lord. ALL: Amen!

Bedrooms: Stay with us Lord, when night has come.

Bless this room, O Lord. ALL: Amen!

Bathroom: Cleanse us from all sin. Bless this room, O Lord. ALL: Amen!

All return to the front door to pray together.

Leader: Let us pray as Jesus taught us:

Our Father . . .

The leader sprinkles all present with holy water.

Bless this household through all days to come,


Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, forever and ever.


