

# second sunday of Lent

**MARCH 5, 2023** 


Today's first reading from Genesis showcases one of God's greatest characteristics: faithfulness. God's talk with Abram comes from generations of human failure. The early chapters of Genesis are riddled with instances of humans falling short: Adam and Eve disobey God in the garden; Cain murders his brother Abel; the wickedness of humankind rises to the point that God wipes out nearly all of creation in a flood. Time and again, God's beloved people disappoint. Time and again, God forgives. God chooses to remain faithful to the ones whom God carefully knit together. God promises the divine blessing will be with Abram and, through him, with all communities of earth. Across time, God never gives up on us. May we not give up on each other either. Made in the image of God, may we strive to grow more faithful each day.

The transfiguration of the gospel is a mysterious thing: it reveals something about who Jesus is, but leaves the disciples (and us) with as many questions as answers. There is both light and shadow in this moment of revelation. We may wish that God would communicate more directly with us; we ask for signs and signals to indicate God's will. Here, though, the disciples who do actually hear God's voice fall to the ground in fear. God does not say anything terribly challenging: the voice in fact affirms that they are doing well in entrusting their lives to Jesus. But there is something about it that overwhelms them. Encountering God in all God's mystery and wildness is not always a reassuring prospect; we are never ready for the ways in which God might call us to change.

Peter, James, and John experienced an incredibly intense spiritual moment as they witnessed Jesus' transfiguration atop the mountain. They saw a great light. They heard the voice of their Creator. They felt the movement of the Spirit washing over them. Then, in a matter of moments, the intensity ended. The three friends needed to make their way down the mountain, back to everyday life. Except, their lives could never be the same. Such a powerful experience of the divine must have awakened something within these men, right?

In our own ways, we each navigate between moments of spiritual intensity and spiritual ordinary. Perhaps you had a "mountaintop moment" during a focused morning of prayer or on a weekend retreat. These moments may feel few and far between - yet we carry their energy when we head back down the mountain and into daily life.

We do not often hear the voice of God as explicitly as the disciples do in the gospel. For most of us, God tends to speak in whispers and hints. This does not mean that God is any less present, but it does make God's presence less obvious. Following God's will for our lives is not always as easy as it is for Abram, who receives clear and direct instructions. For us, it is a matter of learning the tools of discernment so that we can hear God's voice - and remain assured of God's loving presence - as we piece together our paths in life. 

#### OUR FASCINATING FAITH

#### The Scrutinies

Next Sunday, if your parish is blessed with catechumens (now called "elect" during Lent) who are preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil, you will likely celebrate with them the first of three scrutinies. These are rites integral to final Lenten preparations made by the elect, and they are celebrated on three successive Sundays, starting with the Third Sunday of Lent. The Church tells us that the scrutinies are meant to uncover and heal all that is weak and sinful in the lives of the elect. During the week leading up to each celebration, the elect engage in prayerful preparation involving deep reflection on their own lives and the new life to which they are called. The rites themselves use a special form of intercessions specifically directed to the lives of the elect, and include a prayer of exorcism.

It is essential that these rites be celebrated in the midst of the community, so that the elect experience the support of the parish members on this profound journey of faith. But it is equally important that the parish members witness the growing faith of the elect so they may be inspired by it for their Lenten journey of reflection on their own baptism in preparation for Easter.


