

In his rule for monastic living, St. Benedict calls on his brothers to "receive all as Christ." Hospitality is a hallmark of Benedictine spirituality - and the broader Christian life. We need not to be monks or nuns to practice the radical hospitality called for in St. Benedict's Rule and today's gospel. Jesus puts himself in the place of a guest when he tells his apostles "Whoever receives you receives me." He ups the ante even further by adding, "and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me."

To welcome another person is to welcome God, the source of all life, and Christ's very self. For all people are made in the image of God. God dwells within and among each one of us. The friend and the foe, the loved one and the stranger, the joyful, the hurting, the weary and the lost - everyone reflects the image of God in a unique way and deserves to be treated as such.

What does it look like to receive or welcome another in Christ? How can we answer Jesus' call to take up our cross and follow him? Discipleship demands a radical embrace of the divine in our daily lives. Maybe that looks like seeking forgiveness from a colleague. Maybe it looks like welcoming the pain of unhoused neighbor into our heart and allowing it to move us to action. As we move into a new week, consider how you can take up the Christian call to receive others as if you are receiving Christ' very self. *Living Liturgy, p. 165*

### **DISCIPLESHIP QUAD BASICS**



WHAT IS A DISCIPLESHIP QUAD? A Discipleship Quad is a group of four people who journey together as disciples through weekly gatherings of fellowship, ongoing conversion, and learning. This 12-month path of

accompaniment fosters growth through prayer, accountability, and authentic relationships. All members of a Quad should be of the same sex to create an atmosphere of intimacy and vulnerability for sharing. Each Quad has a Coordinator, who serves the temporal needs of the Quad and helps facilitate the conversations by modeling authenticity.

WHO IS A DISCIPLESHIP QUAD FOR? A Discipleship Quad is for any person who has a desire to grow in faith as a Catholic and will commit to adhere to all components of the Discipleship Quad Commitment. A Quad can be made up of people at any level of spiritual maturity, from long-time, committed Catholics to those who are just beginning their spiritual journey with Jesus.

THE BENEFIT TO THE INDIVIDUAL The benefit of a Discipleship Quad to each individual person is knowing the love of Jesus Christ and deepening a relationship with him. Jesus is critical to our ongoing growth in faith and, as such, our peace, joy, and fulfillment in life. As part of a Discipleship Quad, you will get to learn with and from others, pray for and with one another, and share life with those who will become good friends, in an otherwise incredibly busy and complicated world.
