On the night of the Last Supper, Jesus broke bread and proclaimed it his body. He took the cup filled with wine and declared it his blood. Jesus entrusted the promise of eternal life to two of the most essential and enjoyable human actions: eating and drinking. Jesus does not require special skills to attain eternal life. Rather he reveals the hope of everlasting joy in heaven from the ordinary fruits of the earth. Jesus’ gifts of the bread and wine, his very body and blood, make the heavenly kingdom accessible to all who believe.

Our regular partaking of the body and blood in the Eucharist strengthens us for the journey to heaven and draws us around a communion table with others who believe in the power of Christ. The body and blood of Christ is entirely a gift, a grace-filled meal. We cannot earn our place at the Eucharistic table, nor can we lose our seat. Jesus sat among saints and sinners at the Last Supper and throughout his earthly ministry. He welcomed all to join in the feast, and he continues that welcome to us today. We are invited to receive the bread of life and the cup of salvation.

Christ’s body and blood serve as fuel so that we might go out and live into our God-given callings with energy and spirit. The grace broken and poured at the altar extends out into the world. Strengthened by Christ’s body and blood, we will enjoy the fullness of everlasting life with Christ. *Living Liturgy, p. 147*

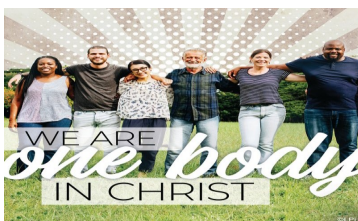

There will be a **Parish Potluck** on Wednesday, June 28 at 6pm in the cafeteria. Please bring a dish to pass.

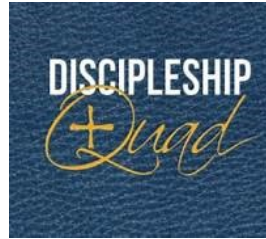

DISCIPLESHIP QUAD BASICS



WHAT IS A DISCIPLESHIP QUAD? A Discipleship Quad is a group of four people who journey together as disciples through weekly gatherings of fellowship, ongoing conversion, and learning. This 12-month path of accompaniment fosters growth

through prayer, accountability, and authentic relationships. All members of a Quad should be of the same sex to create an atmosphere of intimacy and vulnerability for sharing. Each Quad has a Coordinator, who serves the temporal needs of the Quad and helps facilitate the conversations by modeling authenticity.

WHO IS A DISCIPLESHIP QUAD FOR? A Discipleship Quad is for any person who has a desire to grow in faith as a Catholic and will commit to adhere to all components of the Discipleship Quad Commitment. A Quad can be made up of people at any level of spiritual maturity, from long-time, committed Catholics to those who are just beginning their spiritual journey with Jesus.

THE BENEFIT TO THE INDIVIDUAL The benefit of a Discipleship Quad to each individual person is knowing the love of Jesus Christ and deepening a relationship with him. Jesus is critical to our ongoing growth in faith and, as such, our peace, joy, and fulfillment in life. As part of a Discipleship Quad, you will get to learn with and from others, pray for and with one another, and share life with those who will become good friends, in an otherwise incredibly busy and complicated world.

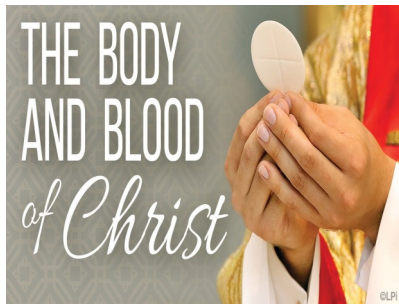
