God wants the Israelites to stay close. “Hearken to my voice and keep my covenant,” God tells the Israelites through Moses. At the time, the Israelites had pitched camp right at the foot of the mountain where God dwells. They believed they were in close proximity to God in a special way, perhaps similar to how we feel when we gather in church for Eucharist. The Israelites journeyed toward God - and God journeyed toward the Israelites. The relationship between God and God’s beloved people goes two ways. Just as we desire closeness with God, God also desires closeness with us. God delights when we carve out time for prayer, serve our neighbors in need, advocate for justice, and take part in the myriad of other ways we keep the divine covenant.

God delights in us. Savor that truth for a moment. God lifts us toward God’s very self. God embraces us just as God embraced our ancestors in Israel. God draws us close - and then remains with us as we go into the world to labor the divine love into being.

Today’s gospel tells of Jesus calling disciples to help enact the gospel work of curing the sick, raising the dead, cleansing the lepers, driving our demons, and proclaiming to the lost: “The kingdom of heaven is at hand.” Jesus calls the disciples to labor for the harvest of the Lord. The Son of God is all powerful and could take care of everything on his own. But like God the Creator, Jesus wants his people to be part of the mission too. *Living Liturgy, p. 153*

DISCIPLESHIP QUAD BASICS



WHAT IS A DISCIPLESHIP QUAD? A Discipleship Quad is a group of four people who journey together as disciples through weekly gatherings of fellowship, ongoing conversion, and learning. This 12-month path of

accompaniment fosters growth through prayer, accountability, and authentic relationships. All members of a Quad should be of the same sex to create an atmosphere of intimacy and vulnerability for sharing. Each Quad has a Coordinator, who serves the temporal needs of the Quad and helps facilitate the conversations by modeling authenticity.

WHO IS A DISCIPLESHIP QUAD FOR? A Discipleship Quad is for any person who has a desire to grow in faith as a Catholic and will commit to adhere to all components of the Discipleship Quad Commitment. A Quad can be made up of people at any level of spiritual maturity, from long-time, committed Catholics to those who are just beginning their spiritual journey with Jesus.

THE BENEFIT TO THE INDIVIDUAL The benefit of a Discipleship Quad to each individual person is knowing the love of Jesus Christ and deepening a relationship with him. Jesus is critical to our ongoing growth in faith and, as such, our peace, joy, and fulfillment in life. As part of a Discipleship Quad, you will get to learn with and from others, pray for and with one another, and share life with those who will become good friends, in an otherwise incredibly busy and complicated world.

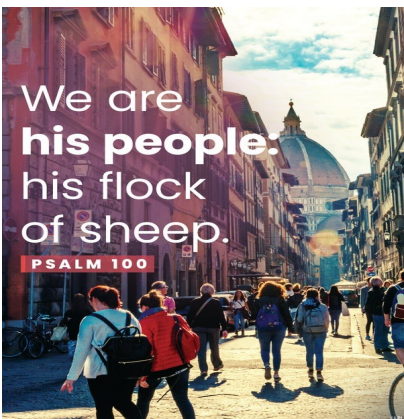

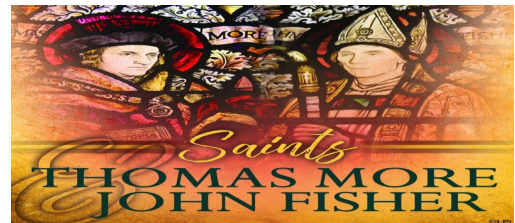
