

The prophet Jeremiah was never one to hold back his feelings from God. His book of Scripture is filled with wailing and lamentations. Jeremiah suffered betrayal and frustration throughout his life - and he let God know it. Jeremiah bared his soul to God - the good, the bad, and everything in between. Through this honesty, trust grew between the great prophet and God almighty. Jeremiah did not lash out for show. He came to believe God could handle anything stirring in his heart. Jeremiah saw God as a partner, one who "is with me, like a mighty champion."

We too call upon God in every moment of our lives, even - perhaps especially - the moments that are not so neat and tidy. God does not need to be protected from our trials. Rather, God longs to draw ever closer to us just as God drew closer to Jeremiah and the great prophets throughout time. God can handle us. God wants to handle us.

Jesus makes God's close presence known to the disciples in today's gospel. He assures them that "even all the hairs of your head are counted" by God. Our God is a God of abundance who creates and reveals all the time. We need only to pay attention. We need only to be honest. We need only to trust God's great love for us. *Living Liturgy*, p. 159

**Totus Tuus** (LATIN FOR "TOTALLY YOURS") is a program of the Diocese of New Ulm that gathers col-

lege students and seminarians into teams of four and sends them out to parishes. The program consists of catechesis, songs, games, food, and the sacraments!

Youth in grades K-6 enjoy a day time program from 9am– 2pm focusing on the mysteries of the rosary and the faith. The day consists of skits, songs, class, Mass, lunch (bring a bag lunch), recess, and other activities. The week finishes with a water fight!

Evening Program From 7:30pm to 9:30pm, Sunday through Thursday, the missionaries host a youth ministry program for those in middle and high school (grades 7-12). The night consists of games, a talk or two by one of the missionaries, small group discussion, prayer, and adoration (on Tuesday night).

## **DISCIPLESHIP QUAD BASICS**



WHAT IS A DISCIPLESHIP QUAD? A Discipleship Quad is a group of four people who journey together as disciples through weekly gatherings of fellowship, ongoing conversion, and learning. This 12-month path of

accompaniment fosters growth through prayer, accountability, and authentic relationships. All members of a Quad should be of the same sex to create an atmosphere of intimacy and vulnerability for sharing. Each Quad has a Coordinator, who serves the temporal needs of the Quad and helps facilitate the conversations by modeling authenticity.

WHO IS A DISCIPLESHIP QUAD FOR? A Discipleship Quad is for any person who has a desire to grow in faith as a Catholic and will commit to adhere to all components of the Discipleship Quad Commitment. A Quad can be made up of people at any level of spiritual maturity, from long-time, committed Catholics to those who are just beginning their spiritual journey with Jesus.

THE BENEFIT TO THE INDIVIDUAL The benefit of a Discipleship Quad to each individual person is knowing the love of Jesus Christ and deepening a relationship with him. Jesus is critical to our ongoing growth in faith and, as such, our peace, joy, and fulfillment in life. As part of a Discipleship Quad, you will get to learn with and from others, pray for and with one another, and share life with those who will become good friends, in an otherwise incredibly busy and complicated world.
