

The presentation of Jesus in the temple showcases the gift of intergenerational relationships. A righteous and devout elder man, Simeon, meets Mary, Joseph, and Jesus in the temple. He responds to the sight of baby Jesus, just forty days old, with awe and wonder. The wise prophet recognizes Jesus as the one who will bring salvation upon all the people. Simeon reflects this reality back to Mary who, as Jesus' mother, will feel the acceptance and rejection of her beloved son deep in her bones.

Today's gospel also introduces us to the prophetess Anna. Advanced in age, Anna experienced various forms of family life throughout her years. Now widowed, Anna worships in the temple day and night. She believed in the Christ Child who would redeem Jerusalem and proclaimed his coming to all who would listen. Anna stands in the prophetic tradition of Old Testament greats like Deborah and Miriam, who prepared the way for God.

With their resolute faith and years of wisdom, Simeon and Anna provide Mary and Joseph with perspective. They remind the new parents of their son's identity. They affirm Jesus' mission to be light for the world. Those of us who parent or care for children know the value of intergenerational perspectives. Families, whether by birth or by choice thrive when members of all ages encourage each other and draw on their experiences for the betterment of the whole.
