

## 2<sup>ND</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi"—which translated means Teacher— "where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." -Jn 1:38-39a

Excerpts from the Lectionary for Mass ©2001, 1998, 1970 CCD

Has God ever spoken to you in a dream? Are you one of the few people who even remembers our dreams? Today's first reading may feel like a foreign experience to most of us. God calls Samuel in his dreams. Three times, the Lord calls the sleeping Samuel to the point of waking him up. Only after the wise elder Eli helps interpret the happenings does Samuel understand and respond to God's call. "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening."

Samuel's experience shows it is not out of the realm of God's power to call us through our dreams. However, dreams during sleep are not the only way in which God communicates God's desires for us. God also calls us through our hopes and daydreams, in times of quiet prayer and in the presence of beloved community. Carve out space to let your mind wander this week. Pay attention to the people, experiences, and interactions that bring you joy. What are the dreams that rest in your heart? How might God be calling you through your desires?

Jesus is perhaps more direct with his calling of the disciples than God was with Samuel. According to John's account, John and his disciples see the Lamb of God walking by and follow him. Jesus prompts the curious followers: "Come, and you will see." He calls the disciples into an experience of encounter. It is by entering into the experience that the followers come to realize their call to be disciples of Jesus. We too can discern our callings by being open to new and unexpected encounters. *Living Liturgy, p. 43* 

#### EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS: Christ Is Anything but Ordinary

We're about to dive headlong into week two of Ordinary Time, and we need to admit, after the hustle and bustle of the holidays, things are indeed looking more ... ordinary, at least in our spiritual lives.

The transcendent highs of the Christmas season are flat lining a bit and the vivid imagery of the Nativity scene has faded. The solemn anticipation of the Advent season is by now a distant memory.

Are you bored yet? Here's a secret: I think that Ordinary Time can actually be quite extraordinary, if we're really living out our baptismal call. In today's Gospel, Jesus point-blank asks Andrew, who is following him after hearing John the Baptist's testimony: "What are you looking for?" He's asking us the same question.

What are you looking for? Why are you following me? Is it for the Christmas cookies and the Advent carols? Is it for the King's Cake on the Epiphany? Is it for the feeling we get on Christmas when we just know God has done a wondrous thing?

None of those things are bad, but they are not what Andrew was looking for, and they were not what Christ promised him when he said, "Come, and you will see." Andrew was looking for the Messiah — the One who makes even Ordinary Time extraordinary. The One who can sanctify the longest and dullest of to-do lists, on the longest and dullest of days. The One whose peace can reign in our homes on January 25, not just December 25. Remember what you are looking for. Come, and you will see. — Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS ©LPi


