"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and everyone that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit." - Jn 15:1-2

Today's passage from John's Gospel recalls the wisdom Jesus shared during his last meal with the disciples. The Son of God uses images from creation to break open his hopes for how the disciples are to be in relationship with one another and with God. Such images would have been familiar to the people of God who prayed with Old Testament images of Israel as the great vine. Jesus tells the disciples: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower." Their followers, then and now, are the branches.

What do these images say about the Christian community? The people of God are all of great value. Branches in a vine mix with each other such that it can be difficult to tell when one branch starts and another ends. So too are our lives interconnected with one another. We cannot be church alone. Further, the Christian community gains its energy from Christ the Vine. Like branches need a strong vine in order to bear fruit, so too does the Christian community need the spirit of Christ in order to bear fruits of service in the world.

Finally, the image of God as the vine grower signals the importance of pruning within the Christian communities. We are not perfect on our own. We need the mercy of God to prune away the sins that stunt our growth and harm others. God created humankind with the capacity to bear great fruit. In order to do so, we must humbly open our hearts to the tending of the vine grower.

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - Branching Out Isn't Always What It's Cracked Up to Be

"That's a really beautiful tree branch. Man, would you look at the bark on that thing? The others are real duds, but that low-hanging branch has really got it all together."

I've never heard anyone say this. Maybe I just need to hang out with more arborists, but I can't recall ever hearing someone admire the particular beauty of a single branch. When someone comments on a tree, it's usually the whole tree — perhaps a visual element of it, like the color of the leaves or its height. But people don't usually zero in on one branch.

Maybe that's because usually, if one branch is looking a little weak, chances are every other branch is, too.

The Bible tells us that when we bear fruit as good everyday stewards, it is for the Father's glory. We are the branch on His magnificent tree. What we have is from Him, and what we do likewise points back to Him. We also tend to reflect how well the other branches around us are incorporating the nutrients coming their way. That's all fine and good in theory. In practice, it can be an arduous exercise in humility.

When I do something virtuous or charitable or kind, there is a part of me that wants to stand out for it. I think that's true for all of us. We've given of ourselves in some way or overcome some human temptation to accomplish a little bit of good in this world, and even though we know God sees us, we'd really love for everyone else to see it, too.

It's a struggle, for sure. But we need to remember that our fruit belongs to the whole tree.

Our Roots to Wings Gala event was a great success.




