We can never know the fullness of our all-powerful, mysterious God. But today's readings point to the crucial aspect of the divine human relationship: our triune God (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) dwells with us, always. Moses recalls, in the first reading, hearing the voice of God coming forth from the fire of a burning bush. He recalls God's fidelity to God's people, taking a nation from another nation. Our divine dialogue looks different than Moses's, God, assures us that God will be with us always until the end of the ages.

In today's gospel, we receive further assurance of God's presence. Out of great love for us, God sent God's only son to save the world. We spent the last few months of Lent and Easter hearing stories of Jesus' time on earth, both before and after his death on the cross. Even death cannot separate us from God!

Then last week we celebrated the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, breathed upon the earliest disciples by Christ himself, who continues to be our advocate and guide. Our triune God dwells with us and invites us into the divine relationship. As Saint Paul writes in today's second reading: "The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ..."

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS: God Doesn't Take a Break

An acquaintance who works in church ministry once told me a story about one of the students she had in Faith Formation. This student informed my friend that his family doesn't come to Mass in summer. "God takes a break in summer, and so do we," he said.

There's a lot to unpack here. First, it's tragic to think of anyone voluntarily missing out on the Eucharist for so long. It's also a real problem in the church today that a lot of our folks don't understand the beauty of the Sunday obligation. But if I had to dissect this situation and pinpoint the thing I find most troubling, it's the idea of God taking a break.

I hope it's starting to look like summer where you are. We've still got a few weeks left before it's official, but the school year should be winding up for most kids, the birds should be chirping a little louder, and hopefully your lawn is starting to green up nicely. You're probably daydreaming about the annual cabin getaway weekend or waterskiing on the Fourth of July.

All in all, summer is going to be a nice break, even if — like typical Americans — our break is full of productive work.

God — literally — that He doesn't take a break, even if we do. Can we try to remember that, even in the midst of our many wonderful distractions? Let's enjoy this summer. Let's live it to the full. But let's see it for the gift that it is — and remember the thanks we owe the Giver.

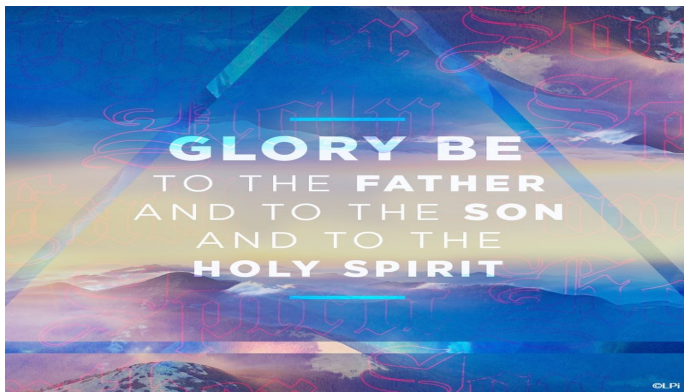

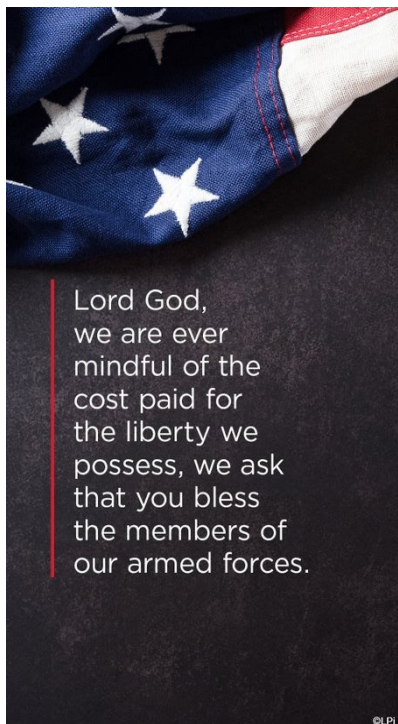
