Suffering separates. It leaves those like the woman in today's gospel anguishing in physical and emotional pain. Her community excluded this woman because of her hemorrhaging, deeming her ritually unclean. By the time she got to Jesus, the woman must have been exhausted. She must have tried countless doctors and remedies. Nothing was working. The woman knew she was not supposed to be out in the crowd. She knew the judgments people would pass as she sought healing. Nevertheless, she persisted.

This woman believed in Jesus' power to heal, and nothing was going to stop her from his help. The woman elbowed her way through the masses to get close enough to Jesus to touch the fringe of his garment. Her hemorrhaging stops. After being cast out for a dozen years the woman bravely declares her faith for all to hear. She shared her story, which was part of the healing, too.

In today's second reading, Saint Paul addresses the practice of generosity. It is not enough, he says, to excel in faith, discourse, knowledge, earnestness, and love. You must also excel in being gracious. Saint Paul pits forth a vision of community where people with abundance provide for the need of those who have less. Jesus provides the model for exceling in generosity. The Son of God gave up his very life so that humankind may be raised up. In this spirit, we too are asked to use our time, talents, and treasures in service of others. We are called to care for the most vulnerable among us through tangible actions. Who might God be calling you to excel in generosity toward these days?

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS: Touching the Cloak of Christ

Look to today's Gospel and you'll find one of the most arresting images in all of Scripture. Christ in a crowd, everyone clamoring for his attention, pressing against him. Several feet away, is a chronically ill woman, weak and desperate for help. She knows she doesn't have a chance of getting his attention. She has no connections. She has no strength. All she can do is lift up her hand.

So that's what she does. She reaches out.

There comes a time, or maybe several times, in each of our lives when we become this woman. We're tired and we're sick. Is it with sin? With fear? With anger? It doesn't matter. Whatever it is, it's made us weak, and we feel like we've run out of options. We've looked for help and come up empty. We've consulted friends and gotten nowhere. We're lost in the crowd of life, unable to stick our heads above the pressing throng to wave for help.

And there is Christ, always passing by us. The hem of his cloak is never far from our grasp. We have no hope of a big miracle like the synagogue leader. We don't even bother asking for that. But that cloak ... we can touch that cloak. That's something we can do.

Do we do it, though? Do we have the confidence of that sick, beaten-down woman who knew so totally that healing was there for the taking? Or do we retreat back into the crowd, stumbling back home with our pain and our sinfulness? Reach out, friends. However, whatever, whenever — reach out. Christ will not fail you.

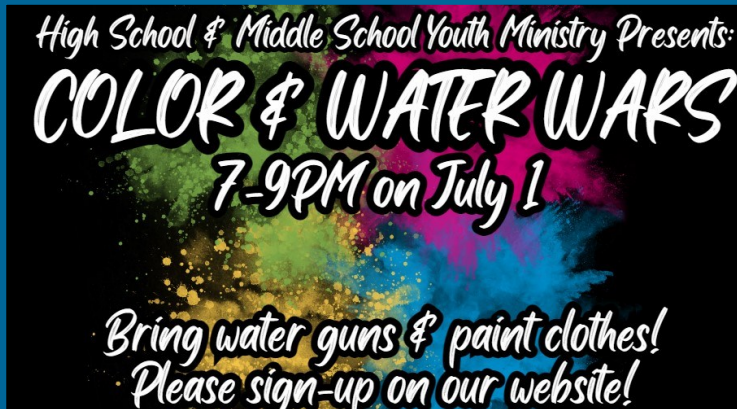

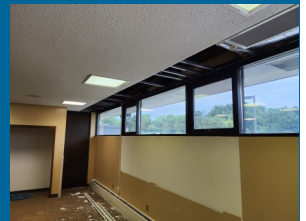
Gavin says he is looking forward to working with everyone at St. A's who help keep the parish running smoothly, as well as having a role where he gets to tackle new and different challenges each day.

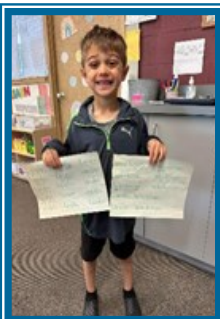
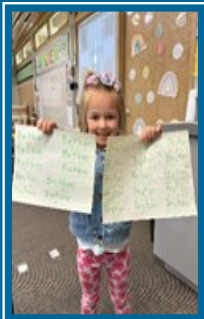


Work

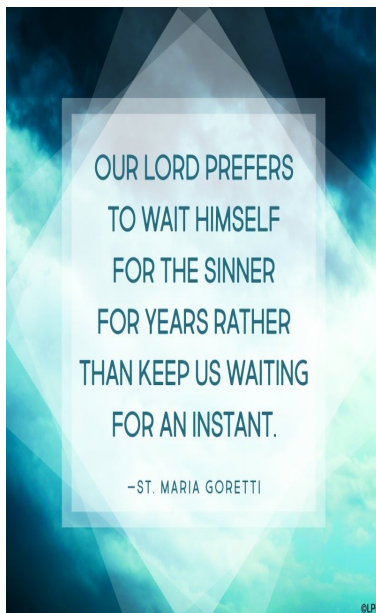
